# Get to Know Our Church Better



# **COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES**

# APRIL 18, 2024 (Not approved by Council)

**PRESENT:** Joni and Stan Kumpula, Sue Kimmel, Karen Holle, Cindy Gulbrandson, Pastor Torri, Mike Schmitt, Gunder Austin, Steve Erickson, Mike Bohanon, (Connie Schmitt by zoom), Caryl Allan

Steve called the meeting to order. Pastor Torri offered a convening prayer.

The agenda was approved as written. Minutes were approved with minor corrections. Stan/Caryl.

<u>Discussion and Approval of Constitution Rewrite:</u> Karen sent out the new church Constitution so everyone could read it before the meeting. The section of the document regarding "membership" mentions that a person "who has been baptized" may become a member of the church. There was much discussion about the words "who has been baptized" because there are people at Union who were raised in churches that did not believe in baptism. It was decided that this terminology could present a barrier to people wanting to join Union and that what is really important is that a prospective member acknowledge the importance of Jesus Christ in their own lives and in the life of our church community. **Motion to approve the new Constitution** with this change and a few other minor changes. The new Constitution will be voted on at the semi-annual meeting in July. Gunder/Sue

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Torri reviewed a report of many things she has been working on over the past month. She was very happy with the turnout for the Seder meal and the fact that it was attended by people from three churches. She would like to continue this tradition next year.

<u>Board of Facilities:</u> Mike Bohannon is waiting for a bid from a local person who is interested in taking care of the church lawn. He is waiting for Kerry to return from Texas and will then get a bid for painting a portion of the outside of the church. Jim Allan will install a lockbox at the east double doors of the church, making it easier for authorized people to get into the church for various events.

<u>Board of Personnel:</u> Connie Schmitt reported that the 2024 Letter of Call for Pastor Torri has been completed and signed and will be stored in a locked file cabinet. Staff evaluations have been completed.

<u>Board of Financial Stewardship:</u> Caryl Allan reported that March income was \$9,616 and expenses for the month were \$18,624. Expenses were high this month because quarterly payments were made for Pastor Torri's insurance.

## **Ministry Team Reports:**

Congregational Life: This team will be meeting next week. Nothing to report at this time.

<u>Worship:</u> Pastor Torri reported that the worship team has done well during Heidi's absence. Team members are: Gunder, Gracee, Caryl and Torri. Several pottery pieces are being made for Communion sets that have been incomplete. The potters, Dick and Sandy Pullen, will be donating the pieces to the church. They are regular vendors at the Northwoods Arts Council and we are encouraged to check them out this August.

<u>Women's Fellowship:</u> Joni reported that the April meeting was on gardening and was a lot of fun. Thanks to Mary Parrish for leading the discussion. The Women's Fellowship has just donated \$1,000 to the church for new blinds for the Friendship Hall and for the Library. The Women's Fellowship also donated \$500 to the Minnesota Conference for the mission, Our Church's Wider Mission. Wine making will be the topic for June and chain saw carving is the topic for July.

Men's Fellowship: Stan reported that the men are thinking about interesting trips they might take together this summer. More info coming!

<u>Iustice Ministry Team:</u> The latest book study resulted in conversations expressing differing political views that participants were able to listen to and discuss respectfully. A new book to study is being considered.

Neighbor helping neighbor takes place this year May 17 and 18. People are being asked to sign up at church if you are able to help with the work that weekend. People in the town of Hackensack have been sent letters asking if they have projects they need help with.

The Justice Ministry team assists with Sunday service at Birchview Church. John Parr will organize Saturday activities for Birchview several times each month.

On June 23 there will be a forum following the service. The speaker is Arnold Dahl-Wooley, a two spirited person who speaks on LGBTQ+ issues.

<u>Fundraising:</u> An attempt is being made to ready more space downstairs which can be rented to an outside business or organization. Steve also mentioned that an investment team is being formed to assist in better utilization of the church's financial resources.

<u>Tech Team:</u> Mike Schmitt reported that a soundbar has been installed at the Birchview church to improve the sound of the Sunday worship service.

In the Friendship Hall a new mixer and a set of microphones have been installed. Additionally two more screens are coming to the Friendship Hall for a total of four screens.

In the Sanctuary two new microphones will be installed over the Congregation to improve the sound of singing for those who are listening online.

TDS will be installing fiber optics which will improve our phone service and our streaming service.

Outreach: This team recently met to discuss offering a monthly community meal in the summer. Money earned on these meals will be used to purchase food for the Men's Fellowship's holiday food baskets.

This team is also working on a handbook for use of the Kitchen.

<u>Moderator's Moment:</u> Steve thanked everyone for providing rides for Marilyn to her radiation appointments. Marilyn has enjoyed getting to know church members better and Steve has enjoyed time at home to get other chores done.

#### New Business:

Pastor-Parish Team – It has been many years since we have had an active Pastor/Parish team. Karen presented a write-up of the tasks this team would undertake to improve communication between the Congregation and the Pastor. The goal is to get this team formed and working before the semi-annual meeting in July.

Child Care Pod – We have received rent for the month of March. A fence with a gate will be installed for the children's playground. Money will be requested from the Legion and the Lions for the fencing.

Meeting adjourned. Pastor Torri offered a benediction. Next meeting is May 16. Clerk, Karen Holle

# A decadent treat for springtime

# Lemon Bars

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 3 cups all-purpose flour 360g, divided 2 1/2 cups for crust and 1/2 cup for filling
- 2/3 cups powdered sugar 66g, for the shortbread, plus more for dusting
- □ 1/2 tsp salt
- □ 12 tbsp unsalted butter melted, 170g
- □ 3 tbsp lemon zest zest of three lemons
- □ 3 cups sugar 600g
- □ 8 eggs large, room temperature
- □ 1 cup lemon juice fresh, 240mL



These yummy lemon bars are perfect for an afternoon teatime, picnic, or just as a sweet treat because you deserve it!

- 1. Heat oven to 350F and line a 9x13 baking dish with parchment paper.
- 2. Whisk together 2 1/2 cups of flour (300g) with the powdered sugar and salt, then pour in the melted butter and mix until combined. Alternatively use a stand mixer with a paddle attachment. Optionally add dash of vanilla in with the butter.
- 3. Sprinkle the dough into your lined pan and press down into a flat layer. Bake at 350F for about 20 minutes or until a light golden color.
- 4. While the crust is baking, add the sugar to a food processor and add the zest of three lemons. Pulse until the zest is fully incorporated and sugar is a light yellow color. If you don't have a processor, mince the zest and mix with the sugar in a bag or bowl.
- 5. Add the sugar and remaining half cup of flour to a large bowl and mix well.
- 6. Pour in the lemon juice and add the eggs then mix very well until completely combined.
- 7. Pour the filling onto the warm crust then transfer to oven and bake for about 25 minutes, turning halfway through the bake. Remove from oven and allow to cool for an hour before chilling in the refrigerator for two hours.
- 8. Dust with powdered sugar and cut into bars using a clean, sharp, damp knife. Clean and re-wet the knife after each cut.




