COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

MAY 16, 2024 DRAFT (Not approved by Council yet)

PRESENT: Don and Heidi Hoppe, Cindy Gulbrandson, Stan and Joni Kumpula, Gunder Austin, Mike Schmitt, Steve and Marilyn Erickson, Pastor Torri, Karen Holle, Caryl Allan, Mike Bohanon.

Marilyn called the meeting to order. The agenda was approved with one addition. The minutes were approved as written. Joni/Gunder/passed.

<u>Pastor's Monthly Report to Council:</u> Pastor Torri highlighted Birchview Church. She is encouraging us to skip the early service from time to time and catch the 1:00 service at Birchview. The residents would enjoy seeing new faces at their Sunday service.

Torri also mentioned that at the last Congregational Life meeting, Caryl agreed to become the chair for the team. **Motion: Council approves Caryl Allan as the chair for the Congregational Life ministry team. Joni/Heidi/passed.**

Pastor Torri has several responsibilities for the Minnesota Conference which takes place June 7 and 8. She has begun to get busy with projects as the time of the conference is only a few weeks away. Mike Schmitt will be presenting at the Minnesota Conference on the use of technology in worship services.

<u>Board of Facilities:</u> Mike Bohanon is currently getting bids for wall repair work in the Friendship Hall. He is also getting bids for painting the outside of the church. Mike is still working on finding someone to mow the church lawn. Don Hoppe volunteered to spray the weeds in the gravel around the church.

Council decided that a capital campaign should begin for the eventual replacement of the church roof. This project will fall under the Board of Financial Stewardship.

<u>Board of Personnel:</u> This team is working through Pastor Torri's sabbatical. This includes a job description and contract for the interim pastor (Sheila Hunter).

<u>Board of Financial Stewardship:</u> Total income for the month of May was \$14,871, and expenses were \$17,405. Having a negative balance is common for this time of year. Our final balance for the year is \$21,152.

Ministry Team Reports:

<u>Congregational Life:</u> Caryl feels that one of the main focuses of Congregational Life is to keep in touch with people who have a strong connection to the church, but are not able to get to church very often for various reasons. Calls and cards are used in the effort to reach out to these folks. The church directory will be updated in the fall.

<u>Worship:</u> Heidi reported that we are seeing an average of 32 people in the pews on Sundays in the past four weeks. Eleven people are joining the service online, and 11 people are attending Birchview Church on Sundays.

Heidi mentioned that we need a better way to store church banners which are changed in the Sanctuary on a schedule. Caryl volunteered her husband, Jim, for this project.

<u>Adult Learning:</u> Camino Hackensack: Thirteen pilgrims have paid to be part of Camino Hackensack. Linnea is thrilled with this and is very excited about the event.

Lectio Divina continues to be strong with an average of 7 people attending. At the end of the session the group often sits in silence basking in the glow of the Spirit.

Women's Bible Study: Twelve women are involved in the 2-year Bible study.

Women's Fellowship: Joni reported that 13 women met at Stone Woman Herbals for the May meeting. Men and women are invited to the meeting in June which is going to feature wine making with Don Hoppe.

New blinds have just been installed in the friendship hall. These were paid for by Women's Fellowship and were installed by Gunder Austin.

Men's Fellowship: Stan reported that he is working with Steve Erickson on a list of trips the men might take in the next few months.

<u>Justice Ministry Team:</u> Neighbor Helping Neighbor Community Clean-up is happening this weekend, May 17 and May 18. There are 11 projects to be completed with numerous volunteers signed up to assist.

On June 23, Arnold Dahl-Wooley will be speaking at a forum after church. Arnold is a Two Spirit, LGBTQ public speaker. The Walker Community Church will be invited to our forum and to the brunch which will be served.

A new book study will begin June 10 and will continue to July 15. Steve and Marilyn Erickson will lead the study of the book, <u>Possible</u>; <u>How We Survive and Thrive in an Age of Conflict</u> by William Ury. Meetings will be held Monday nights at 7:30 PM by zoom.

<u>Fundraising:</u> Steve reported that proceeds from our monthly family meals this summer will be going to the Men's Fellowship to purchase food for the Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter food baskets.

<u>Tech Team:</u> Mike Schmitt talked about improvements that have been made in the Sanctuary to the sound system for people listening online. The grand piano has been moved, and a camera may be installed that will allow for better viewing of the pianist.

Outreach: Fifty seven people attended the family meal last evening. The meal program will conclude after Memorial Day for the summer. A monthly meal will be offered in June, July, and August and weekly meals will continue after Labor Day.

<u>Moderator Moment:</u> Marilyn expressed her gratitude for the many rides she received from members of the congregation during her radiation treatment in Brainerd.

Old Business: Sabbatical Planning. Next meeting is June 11 at 10:30.

<u>New Business:</u> Strategic Planning Day. Pastor Torri would like to meet this winter after her sabbatical with the church leadership team to create a 5 year strategic plan for the church.

Request from Mayor Bill regarding fishing contests this summer: We have been asked to contribute \$200 and a team of 2-3 people to help with one of the Fishing Tuesdays at the Hackensack Park Dock. This request was agreed to at the meeting.

Pastor Parrish Team: This will be discussed at the next Moderator/Vice Moderator meeting in June.

Meeting Adjourned. Next meeting is June 20. Notes by Karen Holle.

Celebrating the Past: Women's Fellowship

Some of the earliest organizations within the church were

Sunday School, Ladies Aid Society, and the Young People's Society.

Although Sunday School and Young People's Society no longer exist, The Ladies Aid Society still exists and has grown and changed in many ways but has continued to do the work of the church. Today it is called Women's Fellowship.

They organized fundraisers, "pie and ice cream socials," sponsored recitals or plays, served dinners, and also sponsored a Bazaar in the Summer, with the money earned to help pay for things that were needed.

Some of the best records in the history files and the many journals from the beginning are filled with the work of the Ladies Aid Society.

Summary

Our expenses, especially for Facilities, have been higher than normal. Some of these expenses have come out of budgeted funds and could have been paid from Maintenance, Replacement and Improvement (MRI) reserve funds.

Our revenue is a little low but is normal for this time of year and we expect income to increase as we enter the summer months.

ADULT LEARNING by Judy Hoopman

I want to start with a brief math lesson. I calculated the other day that there are 60 minutes in an hour, 24 hours in a day, and 7 days in a week which then totals 10,080 minutes in a week. I think I spend about 60-90 minutes in Lectio Divina almost every Wednesday. This is a commitment I have made to myself! This also means that I spent just a bit over 1% of my time each week in this devotional practice. What a bang for my buck!!

Seriously though, here is how I feel about my experience with Lectio:

Lectio allows me to have quiet time I need to "still" my busy, active mind, and open my heart; especially in today's world of being busy and on the go. There is a strong sense of sharing and trust in our group, and a relatedness in each of our own spiritual journeys.

Lectio provides a venue of learning about God's messages to us and learning from one another as we share our feelings about a particular word or phrase from scripture.

To sum this up, Lectio allows me "to be present in God's presence."

We will join Women's Fellowship on June 13th at 1:00 pm for their program on Wine Making. Don Hoppe and I will show how we make wine in our homes for our own enjoyment. Don has many years of making all kinds of wine, and they got Joni and me interested in doing it several years ago.

Steve Erickson and I talked about interesting sightseeing trips in Minnesota. Steve has been to many places in the state and came up with 4 of these day trips that could be of interest to all of us. Here is a summary of these, and we would like to hear from you as to your interest in going on one or any of them. You can google these to find more details:

- 1. **Hjemkomst Center:** Exact replica of a 9th century Viking Ship. The museum has other items of interest. Located in Moorhead and open 9-5, M-Sat. Cost is \$11 for seniors.
- 2. **Legacy of the Lakes Museum:** Located in Alexandria, they have a Boat Show on Saturday, July 13th. It has many antique boats and motors in the museum, and on this day, offers a ride in the original 1907 Fay and Bowen Launch that is quite rare and donated by the late Jack Thomas who founded Mann Lake Bee Supply. Cost is \$8 for seniors.
- 3. **Western MN Steam Threshers Reunion in Rollag:** Aug 30th through Sept. 2nd (Labor Day Weekend). All sorts of ancient farm equipment, steam engines, etc. The one day cost is \$15.
- 4. **Lost Forty:** A forest area near Blackduck that survey crews missed when surveying back in 1882. There are 300 to 400-year-old virgin pines. A one mile self-guided walk is available, unless you just go to part of the forest.

Let me know if you have any interest in the trips or need more information about the process, but do come to WF on June 13th!




